Minutes of General Meeting of the Prescott Gem and Mineral Club - August 6th, 2011

Meeting called to order at 10:04 AM. All board members present except Maggi Lieber, Carol Gilson, Don Crenshaw.

Agenda: Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

President Ron Whorton asked that the July General and Board meeting minutes published in the PGMC Newsletter be accepted, with one correction to the Board minutes per 1st VP Programs Marguerite Ahl that the speaker for September be Larry Dee. Vote unanimous to approve.

Show Co-Chair Judy Sullins read the Treasurer's Report: Starting balance \$17,893.08, income \$414.77, expenses \$1,523.78 so a balance on 7/31/2011 was \$16,784.07. August deposit from show was \$4999.25 which brought the beginning balance for August to \$21,783.32. A motion was made by Ed Sullivan to accept the Treasurer's report, seconded by Jane Reynolds. Vote unanimous to approve.

2nd VP Field Trips Mike Brody reported that there will be a field trip August 13th for gray obsidian and brachiopods, meet Chino Valley Safeway at 8AM, no high clearance needed. There will also be a trip the last week of August to Mingus Mt. for red jasper and hematite, no high clearance.

Membership Volunteer Pam Jackson reported that 84 members were present, 8 guests and a lot of new members that signed up at the Show.

Raffle/Silent Auction Volunteer Linda Loschke reminded folks to buy tickets and make donations.

Show Co-Chair Judy Sullins reported on the 2011 Show at ERAU. She thanked everyone who volunteered, approximately 75 people and lots of new faces. She thanked Linda Loschke for organizing the subcommittees. She thanked Independent Director Max Hatch for all his work with ERAU. She said the Sunday Daily Courier did a great job on highlighting the Show with a front page article. The Shows bottom line net was \$7,833.63. Income at the Show was \$4,454.62 and \$544.63 was not used. Last years income at the Show was \$4,494.25. She honored two great volunteers, Margie and Hugh Rathbone. They spent all 4 days at the Show. Fair Coordinator Volunteer Larry Jackson reported at the Show we had zero shoplifting this year thanks to John Munday and all the other volunteers. Federation Liaison Officer Doris Edelman reported that we need a few more people watching the back door where the handicap come in because others try to slip by. Judy Sullins reviewed the Show Vendor Rating Sheet. We received almost all fives...the best, signs and advertising being great. The vendors seemed very happy.

President Ron Whorton introduced the new Federation Liaison Officer Doris Edelman, the new Show Chairman for 2012 Linda Loschke and Judy Sullins will be handling the vendors. As a thank you to workers at the Show see Jackie Brody for a club sticker. Stephanie Allen asked if the club was going to put together a list of our field trip sites and give out to our members. 1st VP Marguerite Ahl said the board needs to take a look at the suggestion and make a recommendation.

Judy Sullins announced that the Club will be participating in the Prescott Faire on the Square, September 3rd through the 5th. We will have a booth which the club pays for and the sellers contribute 10% of their proceeds to the club. Volunteers needed.

Ed Sullivan asked if the Club had any information on the 10 day field trip put on by the RMFMS. Linda Loschke said she may have info.

Independent Director Max Hatch said we need a motion to authorize the Show for next year, August 2, 3 and 4 of 2012 at ERAU. Ed Sullivan made the motion to authorize the Show for 2012, seconded by Stephanie Allen. He also thanked all the volunteers at the Show. A special thank you to the parking folks: Hugh Rathbone, Sully Sullins, Lee Campbell, Frank Oxborrow, Brad Balue, Madelyn Liberati, Ed Sullivan, Vince Albert, Jeff Walker and Paul Loschke. He also thanked Judy Sullins and Maggi Lieber for

all their hard work. He said that ERAU had updated their lighting and they were talking about new AC. Unfortunately, at the Show one of the cooler motors had burned out.

Break taken at 10:54 AM. Meeting resumed at 11:06 AM.

President Whorton said last chance to sign up for new green T-Shirt because must order.

1st VP Programs Marguerite Ahl introduced Stephanie Allen and Jan Reynolds who spoke on a recent trip to the Galapagos Islands. Presentation finished at 11:55 AM.

Motion to adjourn made at 11:58 by Ed Sullivan, seconded by Sheldon Edelman. Raffle followed.

Minutes of Board Meeting of the Prescott Gem and Mineral Club - August 18th, 2011

Meeting called to order at 5:01 PM at the home of President Ron Whorton.

All board members present except for Don Crenshaw, Marguerite Ahl and Maggi Lieber. Guests present Linda Loschke, Jackie Brody and Karyn Bee.

Jackie Brody reported that we need to update our brochures at the Chamber of Commerce and Karyn Bee will be giving a presentation to the Board about starting a kids program for our membership. This would be addition to the existing Education Liaison Cathy Palm-Gessner. Cathy has still not received information on who was given the Club scholarship this spring. Yavapai College is still checking on it. Raffles/Silent Auction Volunteer Linda Loschke said she would volunteer to be part of the committee revamping the scholarship procedures and screening with Cathy. Federation Liaison Doris Edelman said she would also volunteer.

Federation Liaison Doris Edelman reported that she has received the RMFMS Newsletter and found a new contact person. Secretary Heather Redden gave her a copy of the 2011 Certificate of Liability Insurance for our ERAU Show issued 4/11/2011, to go with the dues count which comes due in October and she apologized that she forgot it. 2nd VP Field Trips Mike Brody told Doris that he has made arrangements for the AZC field trip this year and would forward the contact person's name so she can coordinate it with him next year. Doris noted that she is still working on getting an insurance quote locally for the Club.

Show Co-Chair Judy Sullins reviewed the vendor results poll again....only the heat and loading seemed to be a problem and vendors thought the signs and banners were excellent, thanks to Jackie Brody. Judy presented a booklet containing job definitions to the Board to be kept with the records and Heather Redden gave her a small wrote-up with guidelines on the running of the spinning wheel, and results to go with Show records. She also gave the club 2 small, hand held black lights that were donated to the club at the Show. She said that we need a Chamber of Commerce Liaison. Someone to keep brochures filled and to attend the monthly mixer functions to promote the Club. She mentioned that at the Show we were given copies of Rock and Gem to be given away and that in 2009 we had a subscription drive that netted the Club a donation from Rock and Gem....maybe we should look into it again.

2nd VP Field Trips Mike Brody reported that the Ashfork field trip for gray obsidian and fossils (a sharks tooth, ammonite, brachiopods, coral and sponge) was successful with 38 people and 17 cars. Two trips a month seem to make everyone happy. The second first aid kit is being restocked.

A discussion was held on the request that Stephanie Allen made about putting together a booklet on field trip locations to be given to Club members. It was pointed out that historically this has not been done in any of the Clubs and that there are numerous books now like *Gem Trails of Arizona* and *Minerals, Fossils and Fluorescents of Arizona*. The board recommends against a booklet. Jackie Brody introduced Karyn Bee. She has been involved with the AFMS program for the Future Rockhounds of America Program and would like our Club to start a program. She said there are presently 4 kids that are interested. The AFMS has this program in place and we would follow their structure. She has all the information, There would be a Chairman, Co-Chairs and Assistants. It centers around earning badges up to 20 for various age and skill levels. An example, a child would start as a Pebble Pup and earn 6 badges, then go to Rockhound. They would work with other clubs and exchange specimen boxes. They would be responsible for collecting, cleaning and labeling. If they have a sale table, they would run it, handle money. Rock Pal programs give educational presentations. There could be separate meetings and field trips and a separate account they would handle. Independent Director Max Hatch recommended that at this time we could modify our accounting to include a separate budget item. Thus funds they earned could be earmarked for them and at this time we would not have a separate account. Karyn Bee said that she would set things up. She offered to have 2 wire wrapping classes, 5 people each at \$15 each and this would be donated to the Club toward establishing the AFMC Program. Jackie Brody said she would talk to the Treasurer. Max said that last year Don Cunningham was given info on this program but it seems to have been lost in the shuffle.

Independent Director Max Hatch will begin negotiations again with ERAU for the Show next year, Aug 2-5, 2012. Max asked

Linda Loschke to begin attending the Board meetings for the rest of the year because she is going to be Show Chairman for 2012. As of December she is giving up her current position as Raffles/Silent Auction Volunteer. Judy Sullins has volunteered to handle the vendors. He mentioned that the Spinning Wheel was a success so the Club will be begin construction of a wheel. Max also asked President Ron Whorton to notify members if interested in any position to please speak to the President. We will need Secretary, 1st Vice President Programs, Chamber of Commerce Liaison and Show Sign Volunteer.

A discussion was held on switching banks to the National Bank of Arizona. It was decided to leave as is.

Volunteer Photographer/Historian Linda Loschke reported that she has straightened out the photo albums and we will be using binders in 2012.

President Whorton again reviewed the change of meeting date to 3rd Saturday on the month and found a conflict, so maybe the 2nd Saturday should be considered. It will be looked into further before voting.

Motion made to adjourn meeting at 7:12 by President Ron Whorton, seconded by Judy Sullins. Meeting adjourned at 7:13 PM.
