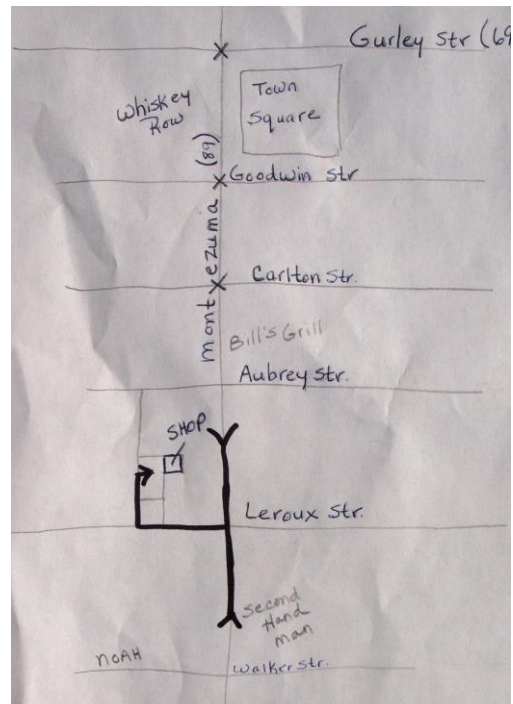

## **UPCOMING PGMC ELECTIONS**

November Elections are coming faster than you think!!! We have three positions that will be up for Elections: Independent Director, VIP of Field Trips, and President. The Independent Director and VIP of Field Trips are terming out and are NOT up for Re-election so we will have to elect New people to those positions. The President position is also up for Election but is not terming out. However, it is more fun to have others running for the position, so if you are interested in running or have someone in mind to nominate, you should do that!

We are also looking for an Election Chairperson to handle the nominations for the Elections in November. I will be asking for a Volunteer for this position at the meeting. If nobody volunteers, I will start making phone calls!!!! This is an excellent opportunity to get more involved with your club!!!!

### **Position Descriptions:**

#### **Independent Director: (Terming Out!)**

The Independent Director is an elected position and is a member of the Board of Directors. The position has a 2-year term. The Independent Director can be re-elected to the same position for a second 2-year term, but after that second term cannot be re-elected to the same position until after a 1-year absence from the position.

The Independent Director is responsible for:

1. Interpreting the Club's By-Laws and making recommendations for updates to same.
2. Interpreting and applying Robert's Rules of Order to the club's meetings.



3. Reviewing and signing any contracts that the club enters into, including:
  1. Annual Gem Show contract
  2. Rental agreement for the club's workshop
4. Reviewing the work of other Directors, including:
  1. Verifying the Treasurer files the appropriate annual IRS reporting. (January)
  2. Verifying the Treasurer files the appropriate annual Arizona Corporation Commission report. (October)
  3. Verifying the Club Liaison submits the appropriate annual insurance request to the Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineral Societies. (December)
  4. Verifying the Club Liaison obtains the necessary insurance riders as required for club activities.
5. Ensuring that the club makes certain annually required votes, including:
  1. The annual vote to hold the Gem Show. (Vote held in September each year.)
  2. The annual vote to fund the Gem Show.
  3. The annual vote to continue the club's workshop. (Vote held in May each year.)
  4. The annual vote to fund the club's workshop.

### **VP of Field Trips: (Termining Out!)**

The VP of Field Trips is an elected position and is a member of the Board of Directors. The position has a 2-year term. The Vice President for Field Trips is responsible for coordination of the monthly field trips to collect rocks, minerals and fossils. The Field Trip Leader will head a committee, who will plan the upcoming Club field trips, taking into account the season of the year and the location of the sites. Trip Leader should be familiar with the collection site, be equipped with maps and a GPS (if possible).

### **President:**

The President is an elected position and is a member of the Board of Directors. The position has a 2-year term. The President provides overall leadership for the Club. With the Executive Board, the President defines and promotes the long-term goals and objectives of the Club. Preside over the monthly General and Board Meetings.

**Club Liaison:** The Club Liaison is the liaison to the Rocky Federation of Mineralogical Societies (RMFMS), the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies (AFMS), and any other club or society. The Club Liaison is also the liaison to the Prescott and Prescott Valley Chambers of Commerce and is responsible for reviewing Chambers of Commerce bulletins and reporting to Club members activities that may be of interest.

### **Prescott Gem and Mineral Club, October 6th, 2018 General Meeting Minutes**

The meeting was held at the Moose Lodge, 6501 East 6<sup>th</sup> St, Prescott Valley, AZ.

Call to order at 9:35 am by President Colleen Denton. The Pledge of Allegiance is conducted.

Additional board members in attendance were: Nick Sacchetti, Carolyn Johnson, John Munday.

Deja Jetmir, Shane Slay and Linda Loschke were absent. Carolyn Johnson recorded the minutes in Deja's absence.

**Treasurer's report:** Carolyn Johnson reported the following:

Current Balances: Checking Account: \$6,125.14, Savings Account: \$5.00, Escrow: \$949.08, Savings: \$26,363.677, Money Market: \$47,677.57, Total Club funds: \$81,120.46.

**Programs Update:** Nick Sacchetti reported that 6 people volunteered to be in the Education Work Group (including Nick). They looked at some candidate displays. The club Fluorescent Mineral Display Booth was "strongly" invited to Earth Day on Cortez St in Prescott (near the 4/22/19 weekend). They first need informational posters for display, then looking for interactive displays/exhibits for our show next August and for schools. Nick has five sheets with examples that were donated by a Penn State professor, come up during break to see them. Nick would like to keep adding each year to support our charter of education. Nick mentioned he needs artistic folks for posters and information and builders (with some engineering) for displays. Please see Nick if you are interested for visual communications or joining the Education Work Group, we need your help.

Program at General Meeting 10/6/18 is Roadside Geology on the way from Phoenix to Prescott, Steve Maslansky, RG CPG, a professional Geologist and life-long mineral collector.

Program at the General Meeting on 11/3/18 is by Jim Turner – History of Turquoise Mining

**Field Trips:** Shane Slay was not in person but did call in while Colleen reported out. The October Field Trip will be to Orderville, Utah for septarian nodules. The trip is still on for Saturday, October 13<sup>th</sup> if the weather holds up. The trip is dependent on weather. Rt 89 repairs are complete and it is open as of 10/6/18. High clearance vehicles recommended. Make sure the trip is a go before heading out. Paul Coyne mentioned that we are meeting at the rock shop on the left-hand side heading into Orderville at 9 am. There is a pink rock shop across the street. Reminder: You need to be a member to go on the field trips (no guests) due to insurance requirements. If you bring family along, you will need a family membership with the club.

**Club Liaison: Gail Walker**

Colleen mentioned that PGMC will be hosting the Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies (RMFMS) conference in Prescott Valley during our show next year. Gail Walker will be the head host for the RMFMS conference for their annual business meeting. They will need the following support: hotel space, meeting rooms, Banquet dinner (PGMC member can attend the banquet), Editor's breakfast, Delegate meeting on Saturday (PGMC can send a delegate). Benefits – more traffic in out gem show and more notoriety, credibility and visibility with the conference published on RMFMS newsletter and on their website (a link is at the top of our newsletter to the RMFMS website). Gail mentioned that there is lots of good information on the RMFMS website.

RMFMS also will provide ribbons and trophies for best display at our show. A PGMC member mentioned that the last time the judging of display cases was mentioned, the display cases have to meet RMFMS specifications. We would need to obtain the RMFMS specifications to determine the limitations.

Action item for Colleen to get the RMFMS display case specifications and report out at the next meeting.

**Independent Director:** John Munday had nothing to report.

**Show Chairman:** Melanie Capps was not in attendance and there was no report out. Colleen mentioned that Melanie, Linda and Dayle were on Faire on the Square in Prescott.

**Work Shop:** Mike Rowe reported 102 hours last month. Sign up for training or if you have a rock that you want cut, sign up and bring it in to get cut. It is \$3/hr. to use the shop.

**Election Chair:** Jim Turner mentioned that the members should submit nominations with names and positions before the beginning of the next general meeting on October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2018. The election will be held during the general meeting on November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2018. Elections will be done by a show of hands. If there are two candidates and it looks close, there will be written ballots.

Current nominations:

- PGMC President – Colleen Denton
- Club Liaison – Gail Walker
- Independent Director – 2 candidates gave a brief biography describing why they should be elected.
  - Mike Rowe: PGMC member for four years, Workshop foreman, he ran a previous PGMC election, President of HOA
  - Mark Wenden: PGMC member for one year, Workshop foreman, Familiar with budgets, cost benefit analysis and account management
- VP Field Trips position - Jim Turner has been nominated.

Kathy Messersmith want to thank the members that assisted her during the last general meeting. Her jewelry classes are suspended until next year.

**Hospitality:** Jim Turner - Holiday Potluck will be on December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018 and he needs volunteers. Please sign up with identifying your dish on the signup sheet by the front door of the meeting. The club did not use catering for the Holiday Potluck.

There was a motion for the club to reimburse the member bringing meat. An amendment was raised to include the cooking oil for deep-frying. First David Eagle, second by Gail Walker, and the members unanimously agree to reimburse club members for the meat and cooking oil at the Holiday Potluck on December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018.

Colleen mentioned that she spoke to all of the volunteers except for the Assistant Secretary and the Coffee Crew. All of the volunteers want to continue with the following exceptions:

- Scholarships – Linda Loschke will like to step down. Stephanie Allen and Carolyn Johnson will continue to be on the scholarships committee but a new person is required to lead the committee.
