
NEW SIGN IN PROCEDURE AT MEETINGS


In November, our speaker will be Wayne Ranney, who will be presenting the Geology of the Verde Valley. In December is our Holiday Potluck! Come hungry!!

A big thanks to Pattie Rose for organizing this trip. Remember, we are going again on December 14! We will meet at 8:00 A.M. at the junction of Lake Martinez Road and Red 999Cloud mine road. Google maps will show you how to get there!! It is off the highway 95. Again, there is YUMA WASH to contend with. High clearance, 2 wheel drive is okay. A SHORT DESCRIPTION OF POSITIONS:

VIP for Programs:

The Vice President for Programs makes arrangements for programs, demonstrations or speakers of subjects of interest to members for each monthly Club General Meeting.

Secretary:

The Secretary is responsible for taking minutes at the monthly Club General Meetings and Executive Board Meetings. Maintains all Club minutes and Club Rosters in binders for historical purposes. The last month's information should be filed at the front of the binder. Records should be kept in separate binders (i.e. a binder for General Meeting Minutes and a binder for Board Meeting Minutes) or in separate divisions in one binder. These binders will be stored in the locked cabinet in the storage container located at the Prescott Rodeo Grounds.

Treasurer:

The Treasurer is an elected position and is a member of the Board of Directors. The position is a 2-year term. The Treasurer has the responsibility and authority of PGMC funds, including the receipt and disbursement of those funds. To protect the Club's funds, the Board reserves the right to assign the responsibility for certain funds to various member of the Club's Board of Directors. The Treasurer prepares financial reports for the Club Officers and Members.

We will also be needing a new Volunteer for the Scholarship Committee as Carolyn Johnson will be stepping down from that position!

The meeting was held at the Moose Lodge, 6501 East 6th Street, Prescott Valley, AZ.

Call to order at 9:31 a.m. by President Colleen Denton.

The Pledge of Allegiance is conducted.

Additional board members in attendance were: Nick Saccketti, Deja Rabone, Gail Walker, Jim Turner, and Mike Rowe, and Carolyn Johnson.

Board members absent: Linda Loschke and Melanie Capps

Nick gave the program's update. Jim Turner will be giving a talk on the History of Gold Prospecting in Prescott. Nick reminds everyone that his term is expiring and asks for a volunteer to run for his position.

Jim Turner gave a field trip update. He stated that the Red Cloud Mine Trip signups were closed and there would be a second trip in December due to the limited amount of people that can be in the mine at one time. He gave info on the upcoming trips and gave tips on items for people to bring with them to the trips. Information on the trips will be sent out as they happen.

Gail reminded everyone to use the RMFMS website when planning trips so members can make contact with other clubs and go on field trips with them.

Mike Rowe has nothing to report.

The meeting was held at the PGMC workshop, 438 Montezuma, Suite B, Prescott, Arizona, and called to order at 4:50 p.m. by President Colleen Denton.

Other officers in attendance were Mike Rowe, Carolyn Johnson, Nick Saccketti, Gail Walker, and Jim Turner. Melanie Capps, Linda Loschke and Deja Rabone were absent. Dita Couch and Peggy Vax were in attendance as guests.

Colleen asked if there were any corrections to last month's Board meeting minutes. Gail motioned to approve the minutes as written. Nick seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Colleen opened the meeting to Peggy and Dita who are both interested in sharing the position of VP of Programs. The Board discussed how to handle two people in one position. They figured one would be primary and have voting abilities and the other would be an alternate for when the primary could not be at a meeting. They expressed their desire to work as a team and not split the duties. Nick said he would help them until they were comfortable. Nick then gave the programs update. There is one more talk left this year and then in December it will be the Christmas Potluck.

Carolyn gave the treasure's report, it will be filed. She mentioned that the AZ One account is now closed. She also stated that at the next month's Board meeting the budgets will be discussed. Nick will bring his findings back to the Board to discuss and then bring to the membership. Nick also mentioned that he would like to try to get more volunteers to go out to the schools to try to get more members for the club.

The Board discussed the committee that is being formed for the purpose of looking for properties to build a workshop on. They discussed devising a letter with all the requirements to present to the Board for approval to give to the committee to give them guidance on what they should be focusing on. Colleen volunteered to draft the letter to present to the Board. Jim Turner was asked to be the liaison between the committee and the Board, and he agreed.

With no further business to discuss, Mike Rowe made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Gail Walker seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 6:15 PM
