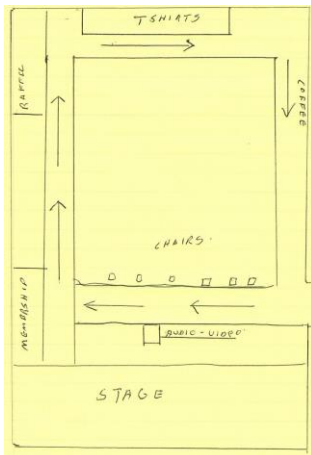
NEW SIGN IN PROCEDURE AT MEETINGS

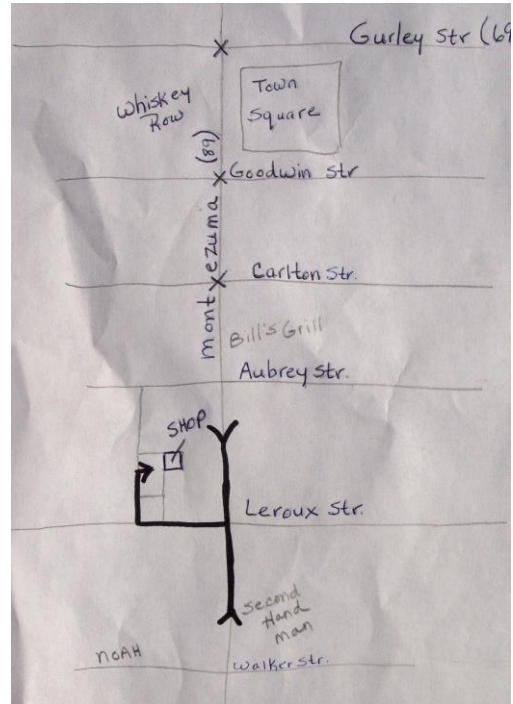

FIELD TRIP REPORT

Please note: You MUST be a paid member of Prescott Gem and Mineral Club to participate in ALL Field Trips!!

- 1) The Quartzite/geode trip was a great success; several new members showed up and had a great time! Very good weather, and a light sprinkle kept the dust down. Pictures are below... A BIG 'thank you' goes out to Steve Ellis for the maps and showing us his geodes.



- 2) Our next trip will be for purple saginite near Sheeps Bridge on the Verde river in February. Meet up time for that trip will be 7:30 AM Saturday February 16, at the Blue Hills Cafe in Dewey (Route 69 at Bradshaw Mountain). We must leave at 7:45 sharp, as it is a long (2 hour) rough road drive off Bloody Basin exit/ I-17 down to the Verde River. Also, it is a daunting climb up a hill to a newer collecting area -lots of cactus, some is taller than me- and sliding rock.. Hard soled hiking boots/shoes with good grip are recommended. I have explored this already with Steve

Dudar, and high clearance vehicles are necessary; 4x4 preferred. Hard rock excavation and mining... Bring your 3# or 5# sledgehammers, steel chisels, collecting bags, gloves, and EYE PROTECTION.

If you are not into hard rock mining, there is also plenty of float to pick up, it is just beautiful.

3) Anderson Mine is the next field trip, March 16, 2019. Meet up time and date will be published in the next newsletter. Information here:

[Anderson Mine \(Date Creek project; U-V Mine; Uranium-Air Mine\), Date Creek Basin, Yavapai Co., Arizona, USA](#)

It is about a 3 hour road trip from Prescott, down through Yarnell. This trip is 4X4 only as we will be crossing a large sand wash and some rough country. Bring plenty of water, lunch, and your gathering/mining tools as usual. The weather should be warm. Some of this material is mildly radioactive, so gloves, breathing and eye protection is a must. This material cannot be worked in our club shop! No children on this trip, please.

4) Suggestions and input are solicited and appreciated for YOUR ideas of where you would like to go for our trips this year. Dobell Ranch near Holbrook for petrified wood is coming soon. April 20 is our expected trip date- it is a 3 hour drive. There is a fee, as it is private land.

The meeting was held at the Moose Lodge, 6501 East 6th Street, Prescott Valley, AZ.

Call to order at 9:35 a.m. by President Colleen Denton. The Pledge of Allegiance is conducted.

Additional board members in attendance were: Nick Sacchetti, Carolyn Johnson, Deja Jetmir, Linda Loschke, Jim Turner, Mike Rowe, Gail Walker, and Melanie Capps.

Carolyn gave the treasurer's report.

Nick announced that today Brian Beck will give a talk on the Binghamton and Copper Queen Mines. In February, Nick will give a talk about fluorescent mineral displays. The rest of the schedule will be put in next month's newsletter.

Jim gave a field trip report. January will be to Quartzite and Wiley Wells. He advises everyone to check the newsletter for more information. He states that a walkie talkie is missing and if you have it to please return it to him.

Nick gave an update on the education group and let everyone know that the club's fluorescent display will be set up for Earth Day in downtown Prescott. If anyone would like to volunteer to help the group out, see Nick.

Gail gave the member report for Debbie who is absent. There were 77 members who signed in and 4 guests in attendance. She welcomed the guests and advised we made quorum. She also announced that the dues to the federation have been paid and we are covered for insurance.

Mike acknowledged what a great job Gail and Carolyn did in getting the insurance and non-profit status for the club. He told the members that he sent back the contract for the Prescott Resort with revisions for the Federation banquet.

Colleen clarifies what the banquet is about. The Federation is having their yearly conference here and the club will be hosting them. All club members are invited to the Banquet (must purchase ticket).

Melanie gave show update. She stressed that we will need more volunteers this year. She announces that Debbie Ramsey will be in charge of the volunteers this year. Gail reminds everyone that volunteering is fun and Melanie reminds everyone that they must volunteer to be invited to Colleen's BBQ.

Melanie tells the members that the Federation will supply display cases. There will be prizes and ribbons for the best displays, so let Gail know if you would like to secure a display. The club will have first dibs.

Melanie said we are short on vendor partitions and we need about 39 more. She is verifying the yardage of fabric needed but is asking for volunteers to provide fabric vendors and others to help sew. Dan Hunt states he will check with a fabric supplier he knows of in Phoenix. Kathy Messersmith, Gayle Wilson and Linda Loschke volunteer to help sew.

Melanie states the brochures are made, so please take some and pass them out. She also tells us she has instituted a strict minimum 80% gem, mineral, lapidary policy to the vendors. At least 80% must be gem related and absolutely no mass-produced product. She will strictly enforce it this year by asking them to put it away and if they don't, they will be asked to leave.

Steve Dudar gave the workshop report. There was 25 hours of work, but the shop was closed for most of the month.

Colleen asks if there were any corrections to last month's minutes. John Munday motioned to accept the minutes as written, Gail Walker seconded and the membership voted unanimously to approve the minutes as written.

Kathy Messersmith announces that after her health scare last year, she will begin her free jewelry classes back up.

Colleen announces that we are in need of new hospitality volunteer again. She asks for a volunteer. She also tells the members that every month at the meeting, there will be a bin for donating items for the Christmas raffle this year.

Carolyn went over the scholarships and encouraged people to sign up for them. Linda announced she asked Maggi Lieber to change the newsletter to remove her name from the scholarship position and add Carolyn.

Kathy Messersmith moves for break. Paul Greminger seconds. The membership votes unanimously to break at 10:10 a.m.

Meeting resumes at 10:33 a.m.

Nick introduces Brian Beck who gives a talk on Copper Queen and Binghamton Mines.

Steve Fox moves for adjournment of the meeting. Terry Greminger seconds. The membership votes unanimously to adjourn.

Meeting adjourned at 11:50 a.m.

Prescott Gem and Mineral Club, - Board January 16th, 2019 BOD Meeting Minutes

The meeting was held at the PGMC workshop, 438 Montezuma, Suite B, Prescott, Arizona, and called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Colleen Denton.

Other officers in attendance were: Deja Jetmir- Secretary, Mike Rowe - Independent Director, Carolyn Johnson - Treasurer, and Melanie Capps – Show Chairman, Jim Turner – VP of Field Trips, Gail Walker – Club Liaison.

Nick Sacchetti, and Linda Loschke were absent.

Colleen asks if there are any corrections to minutes from November's board meeting. There are no changes. Gail motions for minutes to be approved as written, Jim seconds, the board agrees unanimously to approve minutes as written.

Carolyn gives the treasure's report with a cash flow statement for 2017 and 2018. It will be filed.

The Board discussed tracking membership numbers. They will follow up with Debbie Ramsey to see what she does for delinquent members. They will also have Maggi Lieber send a reminder email to pay dues.

Carolyn gives a scholarship update. They have \$1700 worth of outstanding scholarships to be paid. The Board discusses changing the rules to include that the participants must show proof of completion before they are reimbursed. Carolyn will bring a proposal for the new rules to the next meeting.

Jim gives a field trip update. He has ordered six (6) new walkie talkies and batteries. One (1) walkie talkie is still missing. He presented a new sign in sheet for field trips that Colleen reminded him that needed the Club's waiver at the top. He also presented a walkie talkie sign out sheet for field trips. Jim talked about the new field trips including a trip to Anderson Mine in March that children will not be able to attend due to possible radioactive minerals in the mine. Colleen reminds everyone that nothing found at Anderson can be cut in the shop because of the radioactivity.

Mike asked Colleen about getting website access. Colleen is forwarding to proper people.

Gail has nothing to report.

Mike gave an update. He has gotten info on T-bills and investments for the club's funds. He also talked about the club taking new payment methods (including a card reader for phones and money texting capabilities). The Board discusses moving all accounts to another bank and separating the money market into two equal amounts. Mike and Colleen will go to Chase to investigate new accounts and present to the Board at the next meeting.

Mike stated that Steve Dudar will go through all the shop waivers and make a list to keep at the shop for easier verification. The signed waivers will be given to the secretary to keep stored. Mike stated that he and Debbie spoke about making sign in easier next month. He will make an aisle behind the projector to give people a spot to queue while waiting to sign in. Colleen will announce at 9:20 that everyone needs to get signed in by 9:30 so we can start the meetings on time.

Mike suggests to raise the dues to an even \$20 for families and \$10 for singles to make payments easier. The Board will discuss further.

Melanie reported that banners will need to be address now that Prescott Valley Event Center changed their name to Finley's Toyota Center. The new banners will cost about \$2000 and the vote will need to go to the membership to approve getting the new banners at the next general meeting in February. Melanie is not able to attend the February General meeting so Colleen will bring it up.

Melanie discussed the Gem Show contract and that we were offered a 3 year contract (first time we were offered a multi-year). This also needs to be discussed and approved in the February General meeting. It would be as follows:

- Year 1: 5% increase
- Year 2: 4% increase
- Year 3: 4% increase

Melanie also mentioned getting partition fabric from JoAnn's which was cheaper than Hobby Lobby.

With no further business discussed. Gail Walker motions to adjourn, Mike Rowe seconds, the Board votes unanimously to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 6:43pm
